The Children's Department is looking forward to providing programs that start young ones on a path of life-long learning. In

The library will also provide engaging programs for teens and adults.





n May 20, Local History hosted an author event with Charlotte-based author Meredith Ritchie. Ritchie's book, Poster Girls, was selected as part of the 2024 North Carolina Reads program. Community members came and learned about her process of writing this debut novel as well as the often untold history of women's involvement in Charlotte's war production factory.



n June, the Local History department hosted a three-part series about the history of World War II. This series, a year in the making, was designed to offer multiple perspectives of the war's deep history. The speakers each offered a different topic and area of expertise for our patrons to appreciate. Dr. Roy Heidicker kicked off the series with a presentation about D-Day on the 80th Anniversary of the event. The

following week, Wilbur Jones, a nationally known military historian, spoke about the roles of American women during the war. The series concluded with Al Cooke sharing about his father's experience as a POW in Germany. To accompany these events, the Local History staff has created a digital exhibit which tells the history of World War II from a local perspective. The exhibit features collections of stories about local

journalism regarding the war, the men who served, and those left behind on the home front. The exhibit's title, "Sure Wish I Was Home" expresses a recurring sentiment of wartime correspondence. We encourage you to view this exhibit and learn about our community during this pivotal time.
