his marked the second year of our community reads program, Wayne County Reads, after the pandemic. The planning committee selected Kindness and Wonder: Why Mr. Rogers Matters Now More than Ever by Gavin Edwards. The book covered the life of Fred Rogers, as well as the making of his show, Mister Rogers' Neighborhood. The committee planned several programs related to the book. At our first event, The Words of Mister Rogers: An Evening with Tony Cartledge, Cartledge, a professor at Campbell University, told of how he came to know Fred Rogers and drew from Mr. Rogers' wisdom and kindness for decades. The second event, Voices

of Our Neighborhood: A Community Gathering allowed attendees to share experiences from their own lives and find common ground. We also planned a screening of A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood and a book club meeting at the Seymour Johnson AFB Library.

Our final large event, the Neighborhood Noise and Nosh, invited our community to the library lawn to celebrate living in a beautiful "neighborhood" with live music, crafts, yard games, food trucks, and more.

Our community partners this year included Seymour Johnson AFB Library, University of Mount Olive Moye Library, Wayne Community College, Wayne Country Day School,

and the Arts Council of Wayne County. Funding was provided by the Friends of the Wayne County Public Library.



whether or not the information you've seen is fact or fiction. Libraries also can help you register to vote, find information about candidates, and in the case of the Goldsboro Library, act as a polling location.

Over the past couple of years, the Goldsboro Library has become more involved in civic engagement activities by hosting events for National Voter Registration Day, informational sessions with the Board of Elections, helping patrons uncover bias in news reporting or websites, and encouraging other libraries to do the same.

This year, we teamed up with the Board of Elections to hold an informational session and create voter photo IDs. This was our fifth year participating in National Voter Registration Day, and our most successful event to date! We registered nine people to vote, looked up polling locations for 17, and pointed several others toward websites with information about the candidates so they could do some research. Recently, candidate signs have been popping up all over the lawn as we get closer to Election Day. The library is a busy place during this time! We encourage everyone to do their research, decide on their choices, make a plan, and vote!
